

Window winged caddis *Hagenella clathrata*

Order: Trichoptera (Caddisflies) Family: Phryganeidae



The Window-winged caddis *Hagenella clathrata* is an attractive day-flying caddisfly. Adults have distinctive orange and black mottled wings, and are commonly seen resting on vegetation in damp tussocky areas. It is found in only a few raised bogs and heaths and is declining in numbers in the UK. Your records of the adults of this elusive caddisfly will assist conservation action.

Shrubs provide habitat for swarming adults. The small pools of water found between grassy tussocks provide larval habitats.
